Brief Description

A regional public comprehensive university offering degrees at the baccalaureate and master's levels and a doctorate in educational leadership. Instructional programs are organized under the schools of Business and Economics, Education, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences and the College of Basic and Applied Sciences. The university provides undergraduate instruction in the education center at nearby Fort Bragg/Pope AFB and at community colleges in its service area. Master's degrees are offered in elementary education, middle grades education, special education, school administration, secondary education, business administration, English, biology, criminal justice, mathematics, psychology, social work, political science, and sociology and a doctoral degree is offered in educational leadership. FSU is committed to equality of opportunity. The University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a student population that reflects the diversity of the region.

History

Established as Howard School in 1867. Became statesupported State Colored Normal School in 1877, and Normal State School in 1926. First four-year class graduated and institution renamed Fayetteville State Teachers College in 1939. Became Fayetteville State College in 1963 and Fayetteville State University in 1969. Merged into the University of North Carolina in 1972.


Location




