Brief Description

Its instructional programs are organized into a college of arts and sciences, college of engineering, and six professional schools (agricultural, business and economics, education, nursing, technology, and graduate studies). North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University is committed to equality of opportunity. To further racial integration, the University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a greater number of white students.

History

Established in 1891 as Agricultural and Mechanical College for Negroes. Temporarily located in Raleigh until moved to Greensboro in 1893. Name changed to Agricultural and Technical College of North Carolina in 1915. Master's program began in 1939. Designated a regional university in 1967 and merged into the University of North Carolina in 1972. Doctoral program began in 1993.


Location


