## Brief Description

A comprehensive university offering programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels. Masters programs are offered in education, marine biology, business administration, accounting, history, English, creative writing, math, teaching, geology, biology, chemistry, nursing, instructional technology, liberal studies, marine sciences, and psychology. A doctoral program in marine biology is offered. Instructional programs are organized into a college of arts and sciences, and three professional schools (business administration, education, and nursing). UNC-W is committed to equality of opportunity. To further racial integration, the University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a greater number of black students.

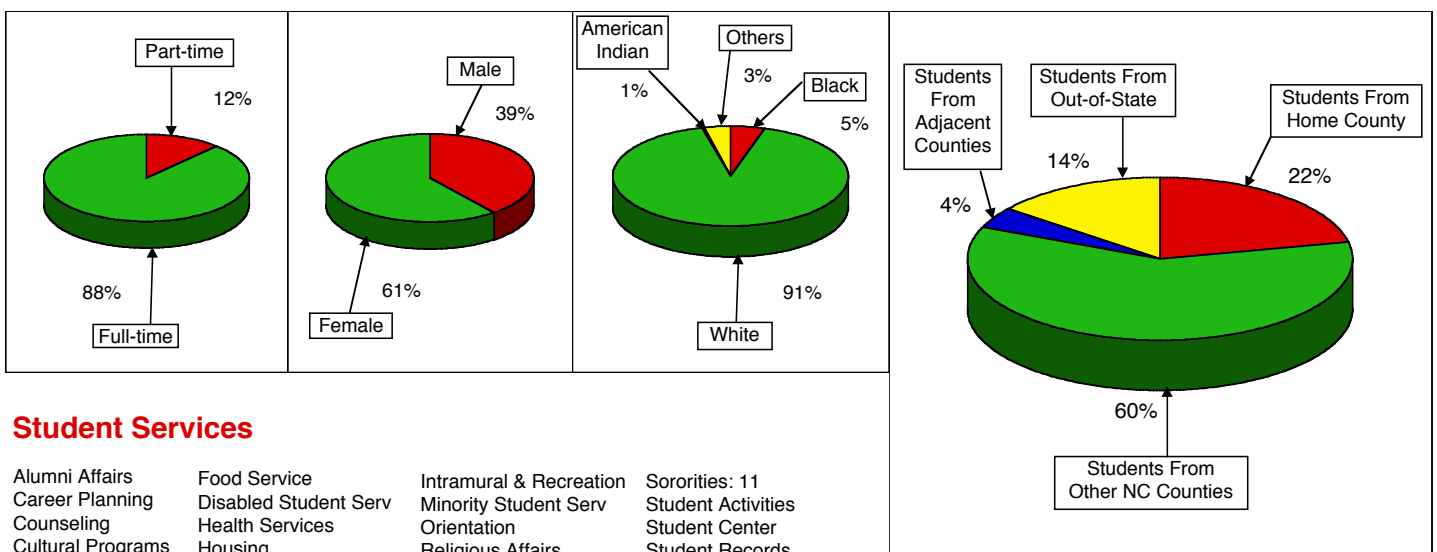
## History

Established as a two-year institution in 1947 under direction of the New Hanover County Board of Education. Accredited as a junior college in 1952. Became part of the North Carolina Community College System in 1958. Became a public senior college in 1963. Merged into the University of North Carolina in 1969.

## Location

UNC-W is located in Wilmington, an historic port city in the southeastern region of the state. Equidistant between the Cape Fear River and the Atlantic Ocean, campus buildings of modified Georgian architecture are nestled among moss-laden oaks and towering pines.

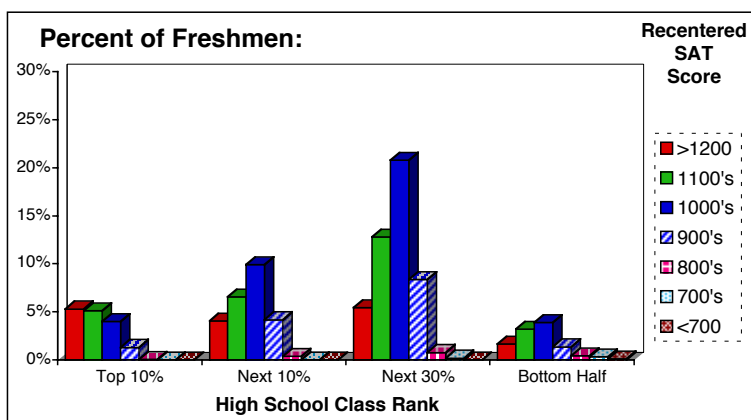
