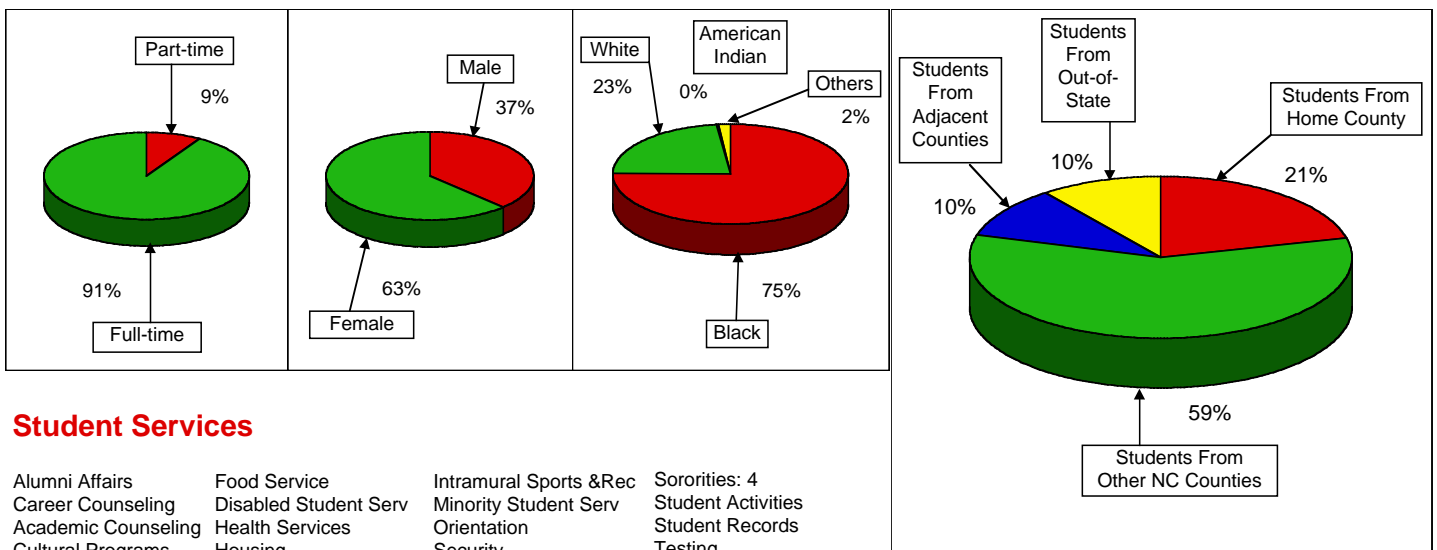
History

Established as the State Colored Normal School in 1891. Name changed to Elizabeth City State Teachers College in 1939; first bachelor's degrees awarded in the same year. Renamed Elizabeth City State College in 1963. Designated a regional University in 1969. Merged into the University of North Carolina in 1972.

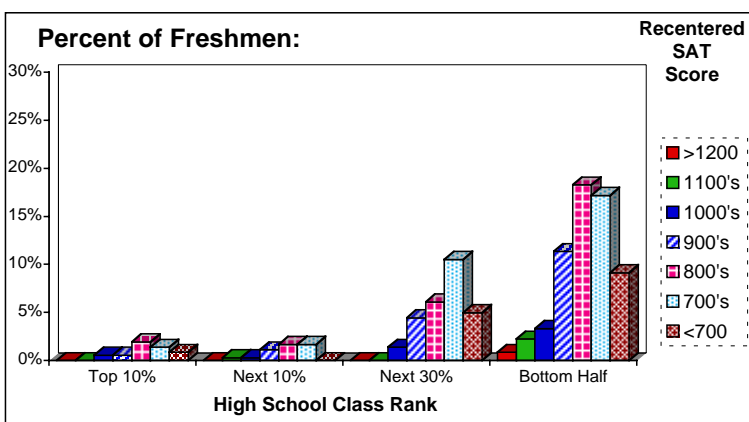
