Brief Description

UNC Charlotte comprises six colleges and professional schools (architecture; arts & sciences; business administration; engineering; education; and nursing and health professions). The University's graduate school conducts a broad array of programs leading to master's degrees, certificates of advanced study, and selected opportunities for doctoral education. Two interinstitutional doctoral programs are offered through the UNC Charlotte Graduate Center. A comprehensive university offering programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels, UNC Charlotte has been recognized by Barron's 300 and U.S. News & World Report as an excellent comprehensive university. UNC Charlotte is committed to equality of opportunity. To further racial integration, the University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a greater number of black students.

History

Established as Charlotte Center of the University of North Carolina in 1946. Became Charlotte College, a two-year community college, in 1949 and a four-year, state-supported college in 1963. Merged into the University of North Carolina in 1965.

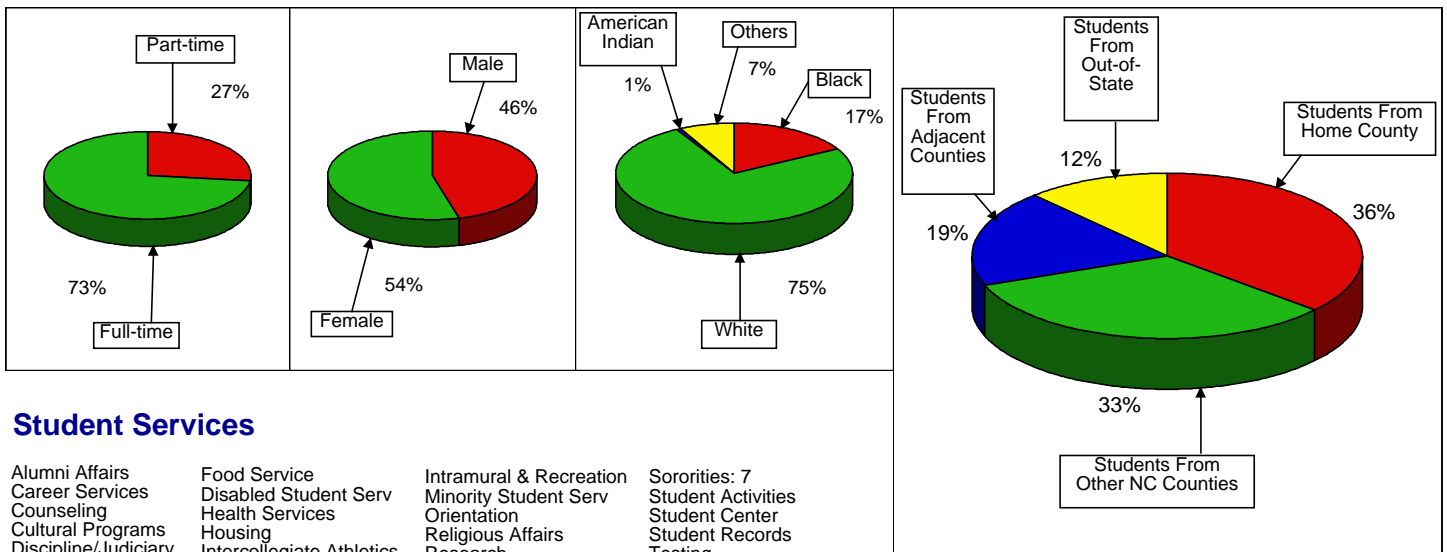
Location

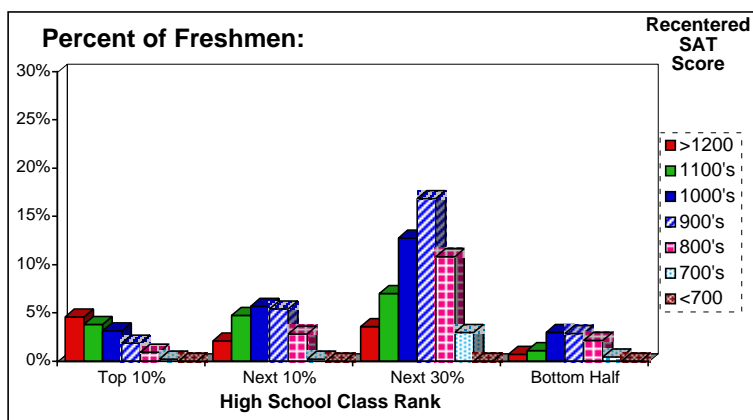
