## Brief Description

A comprehensive university offering degree programs at the baccalaureate level and a Master of Arts in Education which includes six different certification areas and a Master of Science in Organizational Leadership & Management, a Master of Science in Business Administration, and a Master of Arts in School Counseling and Agency Counseling. Its instructional programs are organized in 18 academic departments. The University of North Carolina at Pembroke is committed to equality of opportunity. To further racial integration, the University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a greater number of African-American and Native American students.

## History

Established in 1887 as a state school for the Indians of Robeson County, UNCP was originally designated as the Croatan Normal School. The name soon changed to Pembroke State College for Indians, and the first four-year degrees were awarded in 1940. Soon after, the name was shortened to Pembroke State College. Became Pembroke State University in 1969 and merged into the University of North Carolina in 1972. Renamed the University of North Carolina at Pembroke in 1996.

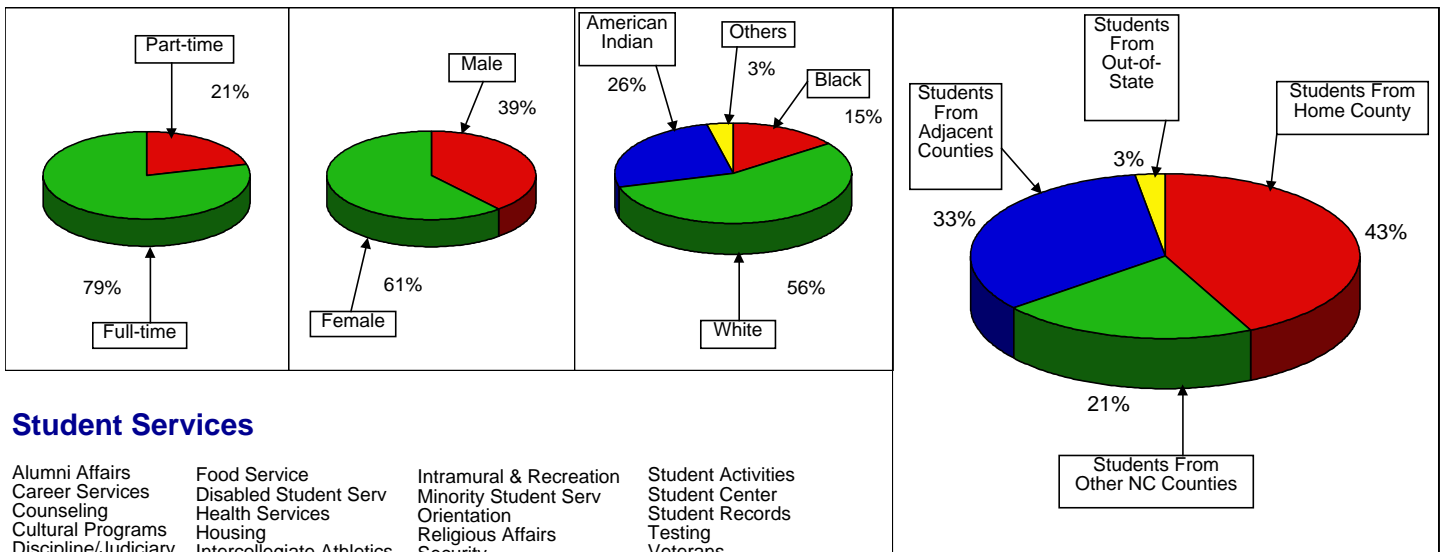
## Location

Pembroke (population: 2,640), in the southeastern region of North Carolina, 1 1/2 hours from the Atlantic Ocean and 1 hour from Pinehurst. Pembroke is 30 minutes south of Fayetteville, a city of 81,118 population. The University is also near Interstate 95 and U.S. 74, major north-south and east-west arteries.

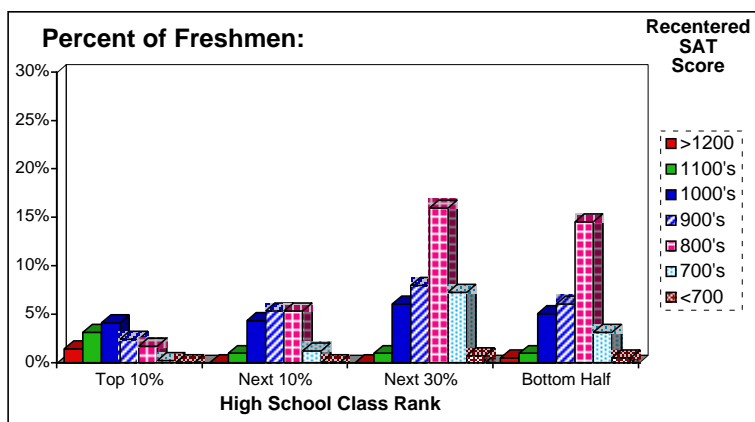
